Taking a break from the saddle, I went on a four-day hike along the lakes outside of Rotorua. I then biked past the fabled Rere Waterfalls to Gisborne on the east coast of the North Island. Today, I'll be leaving the beach and pedaling inland through the Te Urewera National Park to see the legendary Waikaremoana Lake. Wow, so much to see - let's go!





December 27th: Up at 7am feeling refreshed, made coffee and a protein shake, packed my gear, went to the beach for an awesome yoga session, and got on the road at 9am to Morere.
