Although we only cycled together for a few days, it was nice to share the trials and tribulations of road life with such a beautiful soul.

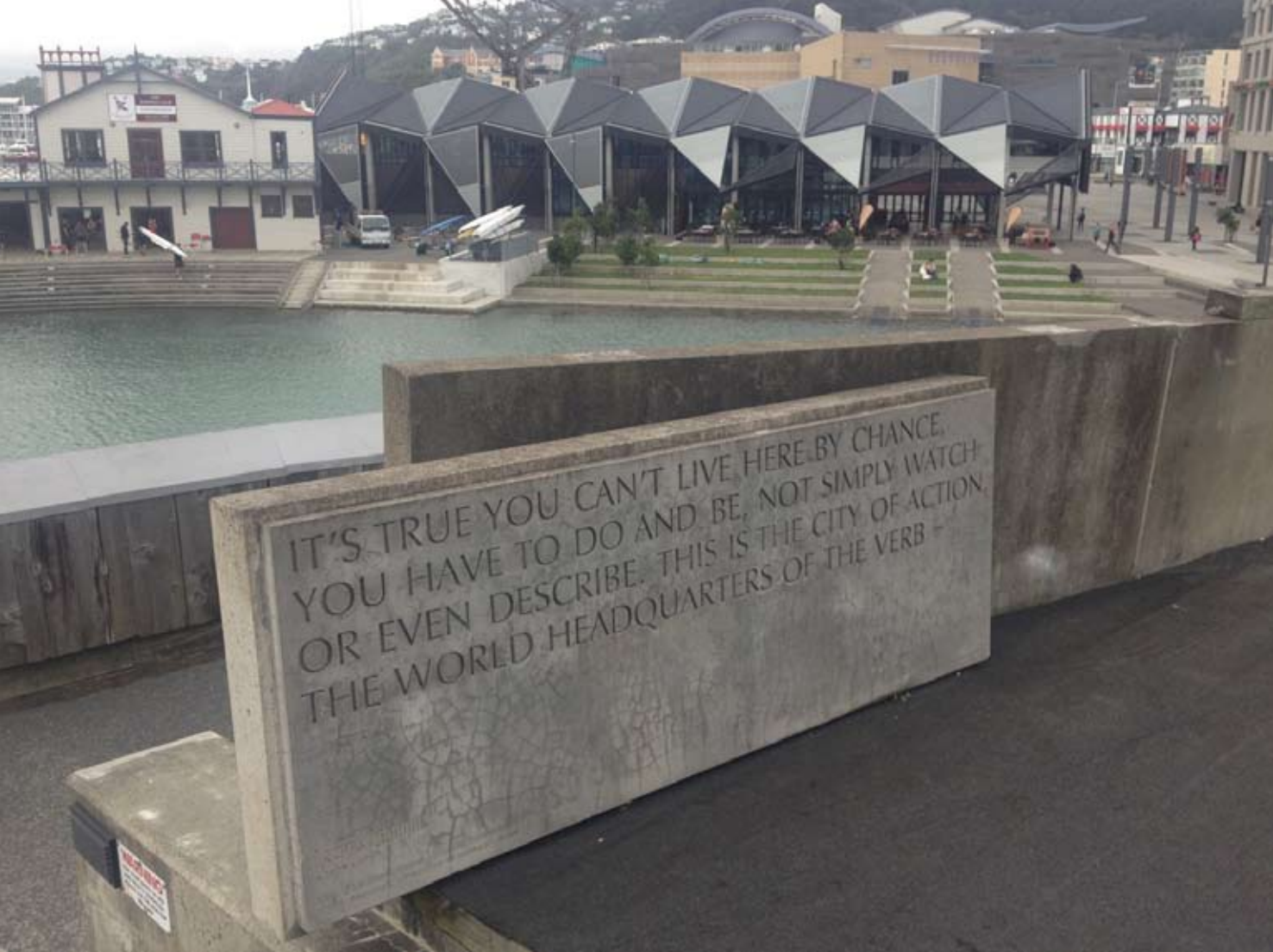
It is quite nice to be back in civilization, as I had missed the convenience of city life. They say you never truly appreciate a glass of water until you have been thirsty.
